Drawing Directions

Step 1: Display the Sample Drawings to the class.

- Show students example artworks for inspiration.
- Remind them:** Do not copy—create your own unique design!
- Students will draw their large cartoon sitting on a big moon using special (special) paper.
- Moon Design**
 - Imagine the moon as a big circle in the background behind the haunted houses.
 - Decorate and color the moon using warm colors: yellow and orange to create a glowing effect.
- Haunted House Design**
 - Draw three haunted houses sitting on a black rolling ground.
 - Color each house solid black to make a spooky silhouette.
 - Color all windows solid yellow.
 - Color the entire sky dark blue.
- Foreground Details**
 - At the bottom of the page, draw a row of three haunted houses.
 - Make the ground black.
 - Color the entire sky dark blue.
 - Add a few Halloween decorations: pumpkins, ghosts, spiders, and bats.
 - You can draw pumpkins, ghosts, spiders, and bats.
 - Use a sharpener to create a glowing moon and light spots?

 - Have I written my name and number at the back of the paper in pencil?

Step 2: Display the Placement Guide page to the class.

- Use the Placement Guide to help place the moon correctly on their page.
- For 2nd grade and up, students could place the moon directly on their own without a guide.
- For 1st grade, students could place the moon accurately on the Placement Guide.

Step 3: Trace the Sample Drawings with Pencil.

- Use the sample drawings to trace the moon and the haunted houses.
- Students could refer to these samples while they drawing their own.

Step 5: Trace the Picture with a Black Sharpie.

- Trace all of your pencil lines carefully with a black sharpie. The picture will look bold and sharp.
- Do not trace or color the moon or any of the glowing light spots unless they can show with warm colors.
