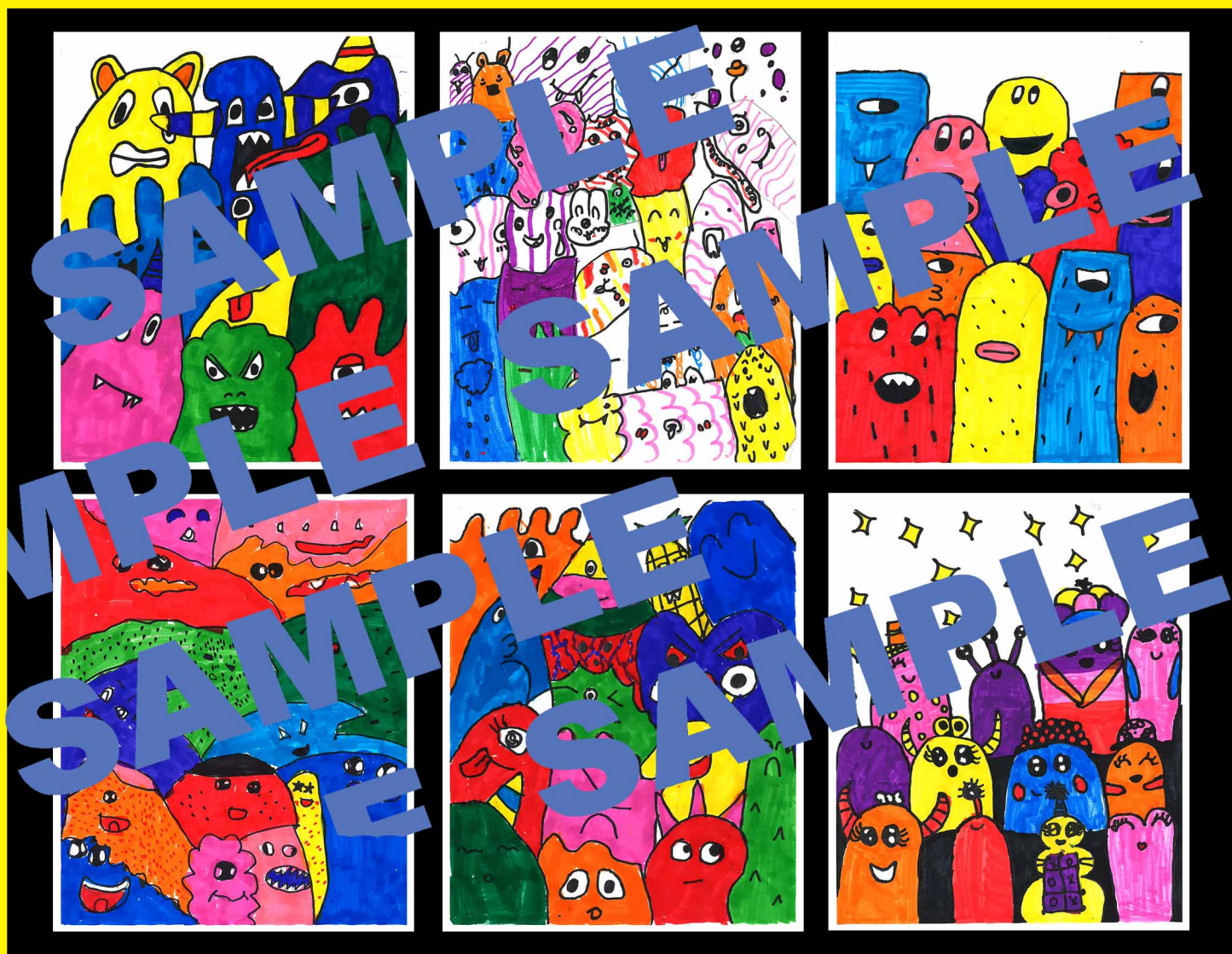

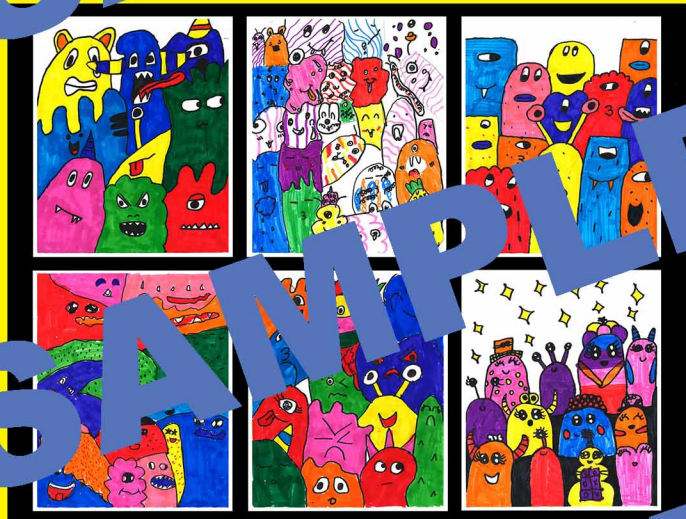

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Sample Drawings

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Step 1: Display

- Show students the sample drawings.
- Remind them to look at the drawings carefully and think about the colors and shapes they like.
- When they are ready, they can start drawing their own.

Step 2: The Picture with Pencil

- Tell them they could refer to these samples while they are drawing.
- Please do not copy the sample drawings.
- Larger patterns and shapes work better and will make more interesting artwork.

Step 4: Trace the Lines

- Pictures which are drawn with sharp lines.

Step 5: The Whole Picture

- Color your drawing with the following required color areas:
• Bright colors to make your monsters stand out!
• Warm colors (reds, oranges, yellows) and cool colors (blues, greens, purples) for fun contrast.
- Color inside the lines carefully to keep your artwork neat.
- Add patterns or textures with your markers to make your monster unique and interesting.
- Don't forget to leave the top part/sky white to make your monster look like it's flying!

Step 6: Final Check for Completion.

- Have I colored inside the lines?
- Did I fill in all parts of my drawing with white space?
- Do my monsters look like they are alive? Can I make them look like they are having fun?
- Are my monsters unique and interesting?
- Have I drawn my monster at the top of the paper in pencil?
