Business School

Students will be able to complete a castle drawing using markers, applying elements of art (line, color, space) and principles of design (balance and emphasis) to create a pleasing composition.

Drawing Directions

Step 1: Display the Sample Drawings to the class.

- Show students example artworks.
- Remind them: *Do not copy—create!* (This is a good time to discuss the importance of originality.)
- Students will draw at least four large castles on separate pieces of paper.
- Castle Details:
- Make sure you have one-to-one time with each student in your class.
 - After the drawing is done, make small groups of various sizes.
 - These groups will have a variety of roles to play during the next activity.
- The groups begin to draw their castles. This helps them to get the drawing started.
- Groups make the scene around the castle.
- Tips for Basic Castle Shapes:
- Walls & Main Building
 - Towers & Turrets: C pointed roofs on top.
 - Doors & Windows: windows, circles for doors.
 - Roofs and Roof Details.
- Add decorations, and with the help of the teacher.
- Add details if you like — clouds, sun, birds, water, etc. (This is a good time to discuss the importance of originality.)
- Make sure your castles still stand out from the background.
- Step 2: Draw the Picture with Pencil.**
- Use a pencil to draw the picture while the teacher is watching.
 - Large groups of students will work on the picture clearly in your final artwork.
- Step 3: Trace the Picture with Sharpie.**
- Trace all the lines with a sharpie. Use all of the pencil lines carefully with a black sharpie. This will make your picture stand out from the background.
- Step 4: Color the Whole Picture with Markers.**
- Color all parts of your drawing — castles, towers, doors, windows, bushes, and background.
 - Use lots of bright colors so your picture is fun and lively.
 - Try not to leave big blank spaces. Make your castles and surroundings colorful!
 - You can layer colors to make shading or mix colors to make new colors like green and blue.

Step 5: Final Check for Completion

- Have I... lines?
- Have I... the picture?
- Have I... all lines?
- Have I... creatively?
- Have I... number... of the paper in pencil?
